2. Chairman's Remarks

K.Whitson welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for attending. It had been a generally mixed year for ESCA – problems with East Lothian Council regarding events on public roads and losing our 25ml Time Trial course due to traffic lights. Rain had been a problem for track league events but not for the weekend promotions. There had been a general increase in members following Great Britain's tremendous success in the cycling events at the Games in Beijing. This had raised general awareness of cycling.

4a - Treasurer's Report

For the year ended 30 September 2010 the Association has a recorded surplus of £1,553 (2009 –£570).

During the year, the Association benefited from Grant Aid from The City of Edinburgh Council for maintenance of our normal stock of track bikes without which we would not be able to support the maintenance programme. The City of Edinburgh Council also agreed to maintain their support provided to our track promotions albeit at a reduced level of £1,500 (a further reduction from the previous year).

The Association continued to support and promote a number of high quality cycling events during 2010 and has agreed to continue to promote the majority of these events in 2010.

Administration and General

Income received from member clubs and individuals increased slightly to £2,354 (2009 - £2,208) as the number members within clubs increased. The sponsorship rebate is an estimate at present as SC have failed to address this matter despite several communications. Administration costs have reduced to £1,063 (2009 - £1,282).

Racing and Championships programme

The promotion of track events produced a small loss of £89 (2009 surplus – £2,609) This is in the main attributable to a reduction in grant aid from City of Edinburgh Council but the standard of promotions being maintained. The events promoted on behalf of SC – the Scottish Track Championships and the Meadowbank GP made losses totalling £520. With grant aid and commercial sponsorship increasingly difficult to find, it has been decided for 2010 to amalgamate the Meadowbank GP and Edinburgh GP into one meeting. Accounts are still outstanding for the ESCA Track Championships.

A small loss was made on time trials due to the cancellation of the ESCA promoted 25ml TT and hillclimb.

Levy income increased from £836 in 2009 to £933 in 2010. This reflects an increase in racing activity in the area. Taken with engraving costs, the Racing and Championships programme made a surplus of £936 (2009 - £409).

Coaching and equipment

The cost of maintaining the track bikes, derny's and other race equipment reduced slightly to £1,502 (2009 – £1,674). The grant aid received from the City of Edinburgh Culture & Leisure Department towards the maintenance of the track bikes and derny's was £1,500 (2009 - £1700).

The Executive agreed to assist a number of coaching qualification costs at a cost of £589.

Balance Sheet

The Balance Sheet summarises the assets and liabilities of the Association as at 30 September 2010.

Forecast for 2011

The Association is committed to promoting a number of high quality promotions in 2011 which require a substantial financial commitment. Sufficient funds must be maintained to cover such losses that may have to be incurred to promote these events. Given the relatively strong financial position of the Association, I would propose to maintain the membership contributions for the ensuing year at the same level as 2010.

2010 Road Race Secretary's Report

Going one better than last year there were 7 road race and APR events held in the East district in 2010, including the popular closed circuit criterium series held at Ingliston. The Scottish road season kicked off again with the Edinburgh RC promoted Round 1 of the 2010 Sup6r Six series held in Gifford.

The 2010 ESCA Road Race Championship was run in conjunction with the Scottish National Junior Road Race Championships - helping to support our younger riders, and was officiated by Chief Commissaire Neil Muir. The traditional circuit featuring the villages of Longformacus, Ellemford and Cranshaws before a long climb to finish on Redstone Rigg, proved very challenging for all riders and produced a worthy winner in first year senior Robert Hassan (Glasgow Wheelers). Robbie deservedly took the win after nosing ahead on the final ascent, 10 seconds ahead of veteran John Kermodie (Dundee Thistle), into a fierce wind following 60 miles of a very testing parcours. Davie Lines (Endura Racing) finished in 3rd place just under 2 minutes behind, and 3:42 behind the winner came (Granite City RT) rider Veli-Matti Raikkonen.

Andy Matheson of the Musselburgh was again crowned East of Scotland Road Champion crossing the line in 5th place overall, and the Junior National Champion is Scott McCrossan (Pedal Power RT) who was placed 8th overall.

Despite doubling up as the Junior National Champs, there was no finishing rider from an ESCA affiliated club so there is no Junior RR award in 2010, which is disappointing.

On an encouraging note, there was great demand for youth racing this year, demonstrated by the numerous youth category entries for the Edinburgh RC promoted Ingliston Criteriums. The ESCA Youth RR championship was held on 8th May at Ingliston and was won by **Angus Gillies** (Peebles CC) after a very strong sprint ensured his claim to the title. Ken Whitson ensured there were medals awarded for all age categories as follows;

- Youth A Girls Champion - Polly Bartlett (Edinburgh RC)
- Youth B Boys Champion - Stuart Balfour (Peebles CC)
- Youth B Girls Champion - Flora Gillies (Peebles CC)
- Youth C/D Boys Champion - Thomas Ottan (Peebles CC)
- Youth C/D Girls Champion - Lulu Bartlett (Edinburgh RC)

I would encourage all affiliated clubs to support the introduction of an ESCA Youth Girls RR Champion as there are just as many young girls riding competitively as the boys and they deserve equal recognition.

After a year and a few months as Road Race Secretary I would like to thank the Executive for their warm welcome and support. However due to work, family and coaching commitments I will be regretfully standing down. It would be great if someone else put their hand up to help support cycling sport in the East.

ESCA Track Secretary`s Report 2010

As ESCA continues to be a centre with a National cycling facility, consequently the Velodrome is a significant part of ESCA's activity. In his report the General Secretary has made reference to many of the track based activities which ESCA supports .

The 2010 track activities will be remembered for several things.

The profile of cycling in the public eye is on the increase and track cycling is regarded as a "cool " sporting activity for youths , particularly young women.

This has seen a significant increase in participation.

The other significant factors was that the weather was much better this season !

One of the actions from 2009 for ESCA was to initiate a certification process to apply to all riders who use the track for "open training" for 2010. This work has been undertaken during the season in collaboration with Meadowbank Sports centre.

As a result we now have a system of accreditation that has seen over 140 riders gain certification as "Track Safe Riders" The details of this can be accessed online by searching for "Meadowbank + accreditation ". The National Track League Committee have proposed that all riders taking part in the Weekly League will require accreditation for the 2011 season.

A system to allow access to the Velodrome by approved key holders has been implemented and seems to be working satisfactorily.

The ESCA track bike loan scheme continues to be very popular and will need some additional safeguards built in to the system for 2011 to keep track of equipment and ensure safe and well maintained machines. ESCA Bikes will only be available to British Cycling licensed riders who are members of ESCA affiliated clubs in 2011

Although the increase in youth riders encouraged by the joint Edinburgh Road Club and Scottish Cycling initiative on Friday afternoons is most encouraging, the entry to the ESCA Youth Championships in 2010 was very poor with a single riders in Junior competition and two youths in other events.

We are moving the day of the ESCA Championships in 2011 to try and address this.

ESCA track riders continue to perform with distinction at the highest levels with 3 Golds, 6 Silvers, and 4 Bronze medals in the British Track Championships; and 1 Gold medal in the European Masters Championships; and 2 Gold, 1 Silver, and 6 Bronze medals in the British Masters Championships. There was also a strong showing from the youth girls in the inter school games, and a Gold medal in the British Universities Championships. The young ESCA riders in the Scotland team that went to Delhi did well with personal best times all round and 2 SILVER MEDALS, and 4th, 5th, 6th 7th and 8th places.

Looking ahead, dialogue continues with the Council about the future of the promised replacement Velodrome. To date these have resulted in declaration of good intention but no good actions. We will keep you posted. The existing track is being maintained in good safe condition and is in regular use for coaching, training, and racing on most days from April to September.

In 2011 ESCA will continue to promote the 21 meetings of the National Track League, the ESCA Championships, the Scottish Championships, the International Grand Prix of Edinburgh meeting, and a British Youth Omnium meeting.

Association 2010 club membership is 446 (ie all affiliated BC members). There are a number of other clubs in our area who have affiliated directly to SC, but have not affiliated to ESCA. The number of ESCA clubs is now 12. 9 other clubs have now affiliated directly to SC and all are listed on SC and BC websites (both the same) under ESCA. ESCA officials, member clubs, and their contacts, are not mentioned. ESCA has duties of discipline over our clubs and members. Who are we responsible for? The Treasurer has reported that some clubs are promoting events that are not known to ESCA which is wrong, and affects the payment of levies. These matters of responsibilities need clarification.

The administration of ESCA has continued to be effective, but with the work load being carried by the Chairman and 7 of the elected officials. The officials (from 4 ESCA clubs) all regularly attended the 10 Executive Committee meetings. No other clubs attended the Executive Committee meetings. We have vacancies for the posts of Vice Chairman, and Mountain Bike Secretary. During the year the Executive Committee authorised the replacement of the speedometers on the Dernies, and issued grants to members to attend courses to qualify as Coaches and Commissaires. We received grants for Track Promotions and Machines Maintenance from the City Council.

There were 31 events on our 2010 road events Calendar. A number of Time trials were cancelled due to problems with the local Council over events and courses in the East Lothian County Council area, (the Police were happy with ESCA's programme and still are), and two Championships were cancelled due to lack of entries. The problems raised by Officials in the County Council's Roads Dept were eventually resolved at meetings with the Chairman & Time trials Secretary and a consultation process established.

New courses have been required in the East Lothian area and have been measured and submitted to the Police for their approval. The 25 Championship had to be cancelled and the EA25/2 course has been withdrawn. The TT Secretary still faces difficulty in completing the BAR competitions as Organisers are still failing to send him result sheets.

The ESCA Senior Road Championship was well attended with a vintage Champion Andy Matheson, but there were no Junior entries. The Youth R Race was held at the Ingliston series with a new Champion Angus Gillies. No MTB Championships were held, but Peebles CC had a series of youth MTB events.

The ESCA Track Championships were reasonably well attended with 13 Seniors and 5 Women, but the Junior and Youth Championship entries were very poor with a single Junior competitor qualifying in only one event of the Omnium, and single Boys and Girls qualifying in only 2 events of their Omniums. The ESCA Track Promotions of the GP of Edinburgh, the SC Championships, and the Meadowbank GP, and the National Track League, continued to be supported but by a reduced grant aid from the City of Edinburgh Council, and were well sponsored by DHL, and Buchanan Motors. We are very grateful for this excellent support. We had a full team of officials, including first aiders and new volunteers for the 'bistro', and the Meadowbank GP & the Championships had excellent entries.

The June GP was badly let down by errors and omissions in the SC and BC Calendars which meant that riders did not know our event was on, and SC much later changed their road Calendar to move the SC Road Championship, with the 25, and the XC Championships; and then BC allowed another open track meeting at Manchester; **all on our weekend!** The BC printed Calendar was published 3 months late and arrived only 4 days before our entries closed. Protests were made to SC and BC, but the damage had been done with a low entry. The Sunday GP was rained off.

In the August Meadowbank GP meeting we promoted the British Omnium Championship, and the British Endurance League (the 15Km Meadowbank GP), and the BC Sprinters and BC Women's Omnium League matches. A good entry (with 14 Women) from all over Britain, and an Irish team, was received. We were rain free and completed the programme with Scottish rider Alistair Rutherford winning the BC Omnium Championship, and local riders winning most honours. We bid for the same set of British events for 2011, but BC has decided that the Omnium Championship is to go to the National Track Championships at Manchester, and the Madison goes to the Revolution programme. That leaves the only outdoors BC Championships as the Deryn (better on a big track Scunthorpe), and the Tandem Sprint (better on a shallower bigger track Newcastle). We have therefore decided **not** to promote 2 major British and international track meetings in 2011, and to concentrate our resources on the June GP of Edinburgh meeting which will have the International Sprint (BC Sprint League), the Women's Omnium League, and the 40th Anniversary running of the Meadowbank GP (BC Endurance League). We also have anticipated there may be reductions in sponsorship and grants in 2011.

The SC Championships were organised by ESCA Treasurer and team and had the largest ever entry over 3 days of excellent racing for all categories and age groups. ESCA riders won the lion's share of the Championships except for the Pursuit, Vets Pursuit, and Womens Pursuit, and with two Scottish Records by Lulu Bartlett in the u/12 girls, and by COERC in the Team Sprint.

The Track League once again caught some rain which affected a number of meetings. The ESCA and SC Championships, the BC Youth Omnium, and the Meadowbank GP meeting WERE ALL DRY !.

The ESCA 2011 Calendar was sent to SC in September, and the road events have to be sent to the Police HQ for their approval. The event registration forms have been sent to club Secretaries with a note on fees, for urgent return direct to SCU. There are 41 events in our approved 2011 Calendar. (plus 21 Track league events). Nothing has been received from SC on their major event dates.

Velodrome maintenance is continuing to be satisfactory (by Tosh Scott for Edinburgh Leisure), and by Buchanan Motors, and by Allister Watson and Graeme Fleming, out of the maintenance grant from the Council for our track machines. Little light has been forthcoming at meetings with Edinburgh Council officials over the promised Velodrome replacement (as an indoor training track and community facility). David Hoy, representing ESCA, has been leading the negotiations (with Allister Watson for SC) following the publication of the SC Facilities Strategy Report which includes and supports our proposals. The Council decided to commission design work for the replacement track this year but there are financial problems which have not been resolved. Further meetings are planned. Edinburgh Leisure have confirmed that they will continue to maintain the existing Velodrome at Meadowbank until the replacement is on stream

At last AGM we reported our continuing dissatisfaction with cooperation from the SC (Director of Operations and staff). Some things did improve. Allister Watson (now on SC Board) resolved the lack of SC action on the Edinburgh Leisure Sports Passes which had denied support for our members. James McCallum had improved SC Calendar planning for road racing, but left office, and there were a number of catastrophic errors and omissions made by SC in both the SC/BC Calendars in 2010. This seriously affected our track and road programmes and event entries and income..

A meeting was held by SC in February about matters of concern between SC and centres, but things have not really improved as far as the SC Calendar is concerned. For 2011, Calendar collaboration with BC has improved since Paul West (i/c Track & BMX) returned to office, but the SC staff were too late in issuing a draft matrix with the SC proposed major events, which caused problems later when they made decisions on SC road programme only which did not fit well with the Track programmes that ESCA had agreed with BC. Hopefully the difficulties we have identified may have now been resolved.

In 2009 a meeting was called by Meadowbank management about access, security, safety, and control of users of the Velodrome. It is clear that SC squads had been using a heavy motorbike on the track that does not comply with regulations, and which was causing damage to the track. (this has now been stopped). Complaints were also made about non ESCA users not signing in and paying, and leaving the track unlocked, and not having qualified supervision to ensure safety (including SC squad). It was agreed that ESCA would initiate a certification process and qualification card issue to cover all users of the track for 2010. Velodrome key holder arrangements would also be reviewed by ESCA and locks changed by M`bank. This has now been done by the Track Secretary.

The SCU moved to S Gyle and instructed a contractor to remove their Portacabin without notifying M`bank management, or ESCA. The contractor cut off the services of water and electricity to the other buildings in regular use, and left the site in an unsafe and unacceptable state, and the buildings were could not be used for our youngsters coaching, & changing, The matter was finally resolved by Sine Munro from SC at a meeting with Ed Leisure, in which SC agreed to cover the costs of all repairs and reinstatement of the site. This has been done by Tosh Scott who has been given the new building by SC in order to avoid any future SC responsibility at Meadowbank. Tosh has allowed us to use the new building for meetings, and for changing, and dope control at the major track meetings. Thanks to Tosh.

ESCA`s competition year was excellent. (see **ROLL OF MERIT** attached) and **RECORDS**. (4e) There were 2 ESCA and Scottish Track Records broken, by one of our youngsters and the COERC Sprint Team. Our members won 3 Golds, 6 Silvers, and 4 Bronze medals in the British Track Championships; and 1 Gold medal in the European Masters Championships; and 2 Gold, 1 Silver, and 6 Bronze medals in the British Masters Championships.. We must be doing something right.

I have read the new SC Annual Report on the disc supplied with the AGM papers. It looks a nice glossy publicity review of what the SC has been up to in 2010, and are planning to do in future.. **BUT** we used to have the annual results achieved by the SC squads published in the AGM papers. There are non on the disc, neither is there any mention of the successes in track racing by Scottish riders at the British Championships and the Commonwealth Games. Apart from David Millar, the `professional` members of the Scotland team did not achieve any success on road or track, and the only glory in the Games came from the sprinters in the young team of ESCA part time club riders who achieved PBs, and **2 SILVER MEDALS**, and 4th, 5th, 6th 7th and 8th places. Well done to them.

Do the SC top brass not recognise successes in track racing any more ?
